Program Overview

Program Structure

- Hands-on activities and age-appropriate projects

Phase 2: Development (Grades 6-8)

- Deeper exploration of supply chain processes and systems
- Introduction to logistics, inventory, and resource management
- Leadership development: goal-setting, decision-making, project management
- Community-based projects connecting classroom learning to real-world impact

Phase 3: Application (Grades 9-12)

- Advanced supply chain concepts: sustainability, global trade, technology integration
- Executive leadership skills: strategic thinking, ethical decision-making, innovation
- Mentorship opportunities with industry professionals
- Capstone projects addressing real community or business challenges
